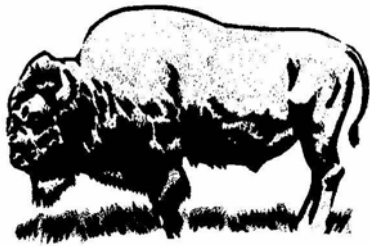

### BVFD Notes



We spent 68 man-hours responding to 25 emergency calls in September. We responded to 23 EMS calls, 1 Vehicle Accident and 1 Miscellaneous Call for a gasoline spill. This brings our calls year to date to 261. The members also spent 24 man-hours performing station and vehicle maintenance with their assigned duty crew.

It's hard to believe but Halloween is only a couple weeks away. Here are some safety tips you can use while Trick or Treating:

- Children should always be accompanied by a responsible adult, preferably the parent.
- Give children flashlights and glow sticks so that others can see them coming.
- Instruct your children to never go inside another person's home, they are to remain outside the front door.
- Let them know that they cannot eat any candy until they get home. This will allow you time to inspect the candy to make sure it's sealed and hasn't been tampered with.
- When possible, children should walk in groups or in pairs. They should never be out alone.
- If your child is wearing a mask with their costume, make sure the mask properly fits and is not obstructing their view.
- Go over stranger danger safety tips with your child before they go out. Instruct your child to never get in a stranger's car.

## Plans move forward for Buffalo Trail

Did you know that Buffalo is part of two national recreation trails? Highway 22, from Davenport to Muscatine, serves as the route for the Mississippi River Trail [MN to LA] and the American Discovery Trail [DE to CA]. These trails are destinations for cyclists throughout the U.S. Developing the Buffalo section of trail will have impact locally, regionally, and nationally as the MRT and ADT continue to be improved by moving off the roads and on to side trails.

The greater Quad Cities area is pretty fortunate to have 65 miles of trail along the Mississippi River. Whether you're a biker, jogger, walker, dog owner, or just love the river, access to the river is a key component of daily life. It's the reason we love living here as well as why people love to visit.

For years, Buffalo has had a plan for expanding the MRT. A **Buffalo MRT Committee** was recently established to discuss grants, promotion, and educating the public about trail developments.

A \$500,000 federal earmark requires a \$115,000 local match to begin the engineering and environmental studies. The plan will run from Wild Cat Den to Utah St. The Bi-State Regional Commission is working to see if 1/3 of the match can be paid by Muscatine and 1/3 by Iowa DOT since the plan involves area outside the city. Are you willing to show your support for the Buffalo MRT? Call your mayor and council member to let them know you're in favor of the trail and attend the Buffalo MRT Pancake Breakfast to help raise money\* and awareness. Your support is truly appreciated,

## Country Cookin'

### Chicken Alfredo

- 4 - Cups cooked Chicken (mainly breasts)
- 1 - can of cream of Chicken soup
- 1 - can of cream of celery soup
- 5 - cups milk
- 1 1/2 - cups of sour cream
- 1 - sm can of mushrooms (opt)
- 1/2 - cup onions chopped
- 1/2 cup celery
- 1 - tsp. salt
- 1 - tsp course ground pepper
- 1 - pkg noodles (not wide)
- 1 - pkg frozen peas or broccoli
- 1 - stick of butter

Brown chicken, set aside. In large pan, cook together 2 soups, milk, onion celery, spices, sour cream, bring to boil.

Add mushrooms, peas, (or broccoli), chicken, and noodles.

Simmer 20 minutes or until noodles are done.

May also want to add some parmesan cheese. We put this over warm dinner rolls or biscuits.

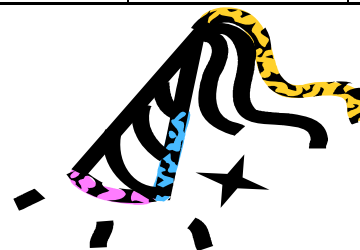
