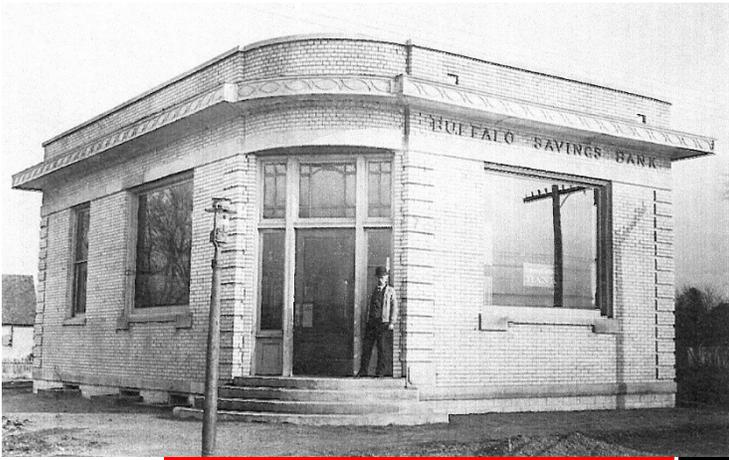

News from ECHO BLUFF RANCH



We strive to keep our property as naturalized as

possible by planting bee and bird loving flowers and not using pesticides. As such, I love it when I have a chance to see hummingbirds.

I have seen many on Facebook recently hand-feeding the hummingbirds. These are amazing little creatures. Your best chance to hand-feed hummingbirds is when they're under stress, which includes this time of year, when some birds are preparing to migrate and unsure of where they'll find their next batch of flowers or feeders. Most North American hummingbirds migrate southward in fall to spend winter in Mexico, the Caribbean Islands, or Central America.

Hummingbirds eat a variety of insects, including mosquitoes, fruit flies, and gnats in flight or aphids on leaves and spiders in their webs. The lower beak of hummingbirds is flexible and can bend as much as 25 degrees when it widens at the base, making a larger surface for catching insects. Hummingbirds hover within insect swarms in a method called "hover-hawking" to facilitate feeding.

To supply energy needs, hummingbirds drink nectar, a sweet liquid inside certain flowers. Like bees, they are able to assess the amount of sugar in the nectar they eat; they normally reject flower types that produce nectar that is less than 10% sugar and prefer those whose sugar content is higher.

Nectar is a mixture of glucose, fructose, and sucrose, and is a poor source of nutrients, requiring hummingbirds to meet their nutritional needs by consuming insects.

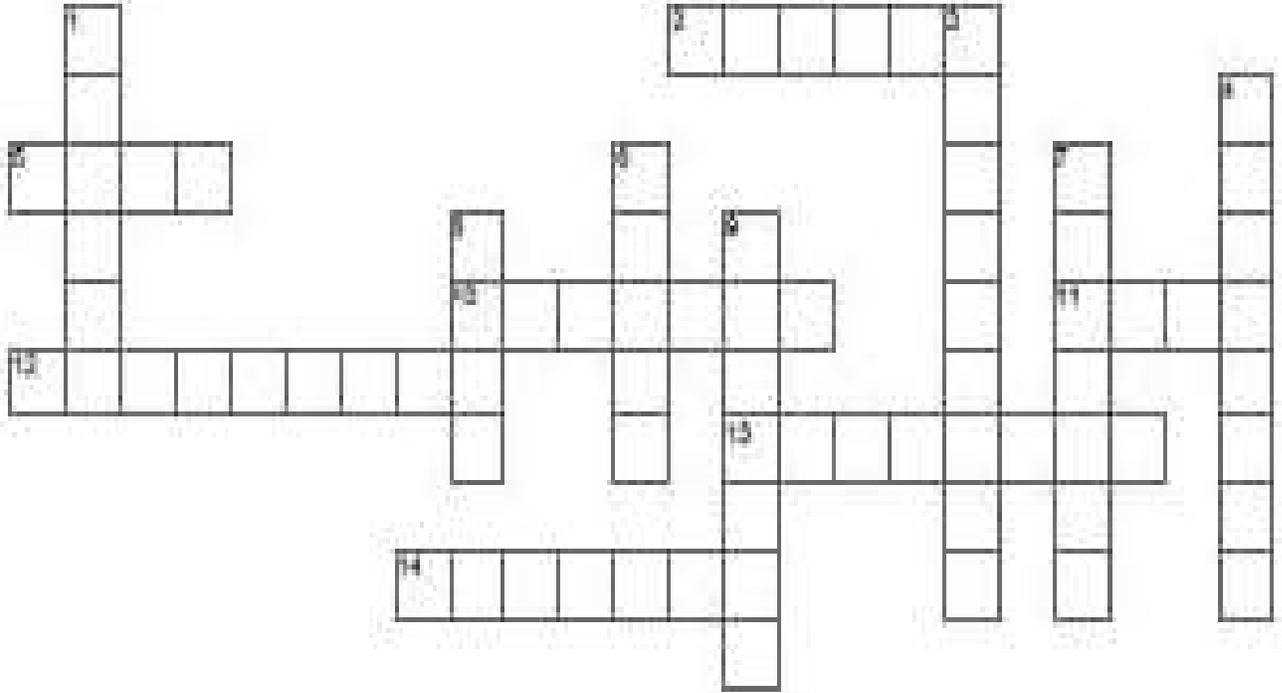

MOTHER'S COOKBOOK



Pumpkin Bars with Sugar Frosting

Beat 2 eggs until light and fluffy
Add 1 cup of sugar, beating until thick and lemon colored

Stir in 2 cups biscuit mix, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1 teaspoon cinnamon, 1 cup mashed cooked pumpkin, 1 teaspoon vanilla and 1/2 cup chopped nuts. Pour into greased 13 x 9 x 2 inch pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 30 to 35 minutes. Let cool.
Makes about three dozen 3 by 1 inch bars

Sugar Frosting

In a saucepan, combine 3 tablespoons butter, 1/2 cup packed brown sugar and 1/4 cup milk. Simmer over low heat, stirring constantly. Cool slightly and stir in 1 cup sifted confectioners' sugar and 3/4 teaspoon vanilla. Spread on warm Pumpkin Bars.

Many of the vintage recipes are from an old Buffalo women's' cookbook, dated June 1921, which was passed to me from my late grandmother, Virginia Carson. See Jan/Feb 2013 edition for more info)

2018-2019 IOWA HOME ENERGY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

WHEN TO APPLY:

- **Elderly (60 & over) and/or disabled:**
October 1, 2018 to April 30, 2019
- **All other households:**
November 1, 2018 to April 30, 2019

WHAT TO TAKE:

- **Proof of Income** (for all household members age 19, and over)
Check stubs from the previous 30 days, award letter from Social Security or 2017 tax return
- **Social Security numbers for all household members** (documentation required)
- **Recent heat bill**
- **Recent electric bill**

WAGE EARNERS:

Please bring copies of your check stubs for the 30-day period preceding the date of application, or a copy of your federal income tax return.

FIXED INCOME:

This income may include: Social Security Benefits, Supplemental Security Income, Family Investment Program, Veteran's Assistance, Unemployment Insurance, and pensions. Please bring copies of your check stubs from the previous 30 days.

SELF-EMPLOYED/FARMERS:

Please bring a copy of your most recent federal income tax return.

FIP RECIPIENTS:

Please bring your current DHS Notice of Decision or contact your local office for acceptable document information.

If you receive alimony or child support, it will also need to be verified.
