Milestones 2022 Farmer's Market Voucher Information

Coupons for the 2022 Farmer's Market season, will once again be processed by mail. If you received coupons last year, you will automatically receive an application in the mail by the end of May. Upon returning your application via mail, you can expect to receive your coupons in 2-3 weeks. If you did not participate last year, but wish to receive an application, please call Milestones at (855) 410-6222. Please see guidelines below.

- Participants must be 60 years of age or older at the time of application (born in or before 1962).
- Participants must live in the service area of the Area Agency on Aging.
- Participants must have a yearly income below \$25,142 if single and \$33,874 for a household of two.
- Lost or stolen checks cannot be replaced. Once SFMNP checks are issued to a participant, the participant is responsible for them.
- Each participant receives ten \$3.00 checks for a total one time benefit of \$30.00.
- SFMNP checks may be used June 1-October 31 at authorized farmers markets, authorized farm stands and authorized Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) farms, where the "Farmers Market Nutrition Program Checks Welcome Here" sign is displayed.
- SFMNP checks may be used to purchase only fresh, unprepared, locally grown fruits, vegetables, herbs and honey. SFMNP checks may not be used to purchase baked goods, eggs, nuts, plants, flowers, crafts, etc.
- SFMNP checks are worth \$3.00 and no change will be given. If the purchase is less than \$3.00 the farmer will add fruits or vegetables as indicated by the participant to make up the difference.

- More than one SFMNP check may be spent with a single farmer. For example, two checks to purchase a bag of apples or three checks to purchase tomatoes and a dozen ears of sweet corn.
- If an item other than locally grown, fresh fruits and/or vegetables is bought from a single vendor, it must be handled as two separate purchases, one using SFMNP checks and the other using cash (e.g., buying vegetables and bakery items).
- The participant must sign each SFMNP check at the market at the time of purchase. Farmers Market vendors cannot accept pre-signed checks.

Buffalo History 101

Hugo Hoffbauer was 12 years of age when his parents came to America and had consequently received his education in the land of his birth, Germany. He accompanied them to Watertown to Janesville, Wisconsin, and then assisted in the construction of the houseboat. Finally, when they took up their residence in Scott County, he did his full share in cultivation of the farm. His life was interrupted by the inauguration of the Civil War, for like the many young men of ambition, Mr. Hoffbauer was very anxious to offer his services in the support of the Union and at the same time win distinction on the field of battle. Therefore he enlisted in the fourteenth Iowa Volunteer Infantry, August 17, 1862. He served as Lieutenant and then as Captain in a little more than two years of service.

Our next event is the weekend of June 25-26
in Nashua, Iowa.

The two-day Civil War reenactment event,
which takes place at the Old Bradford
Pioneer Village at Nashua, home of the little
brown church, is a special chance for visitors
to learn about the 1860s military life. The
union and confederate encampments are
open to the public to show how soldiers and
civilians dressed, cooked and ate during the
war. Visitors can see open fire cooking,
marching drills and medical demonstrations.
They can converse with the reenactors who
are experts on military weapons,
ammunition, battle tactics, methods of
surgery, issues of sanitation and the plague
of disease. They can hear famous speeches,
letters and period music. Especially exciting
is the chance to see a battle reenactment
complete with live mortar demonstrations
and artillery blasts.

Come see what it is all about. It is a 2 hour
and 45 minute drive from Buffalo.

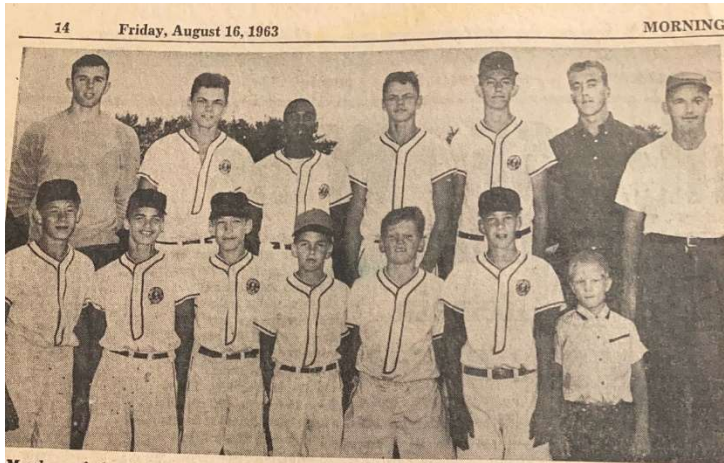

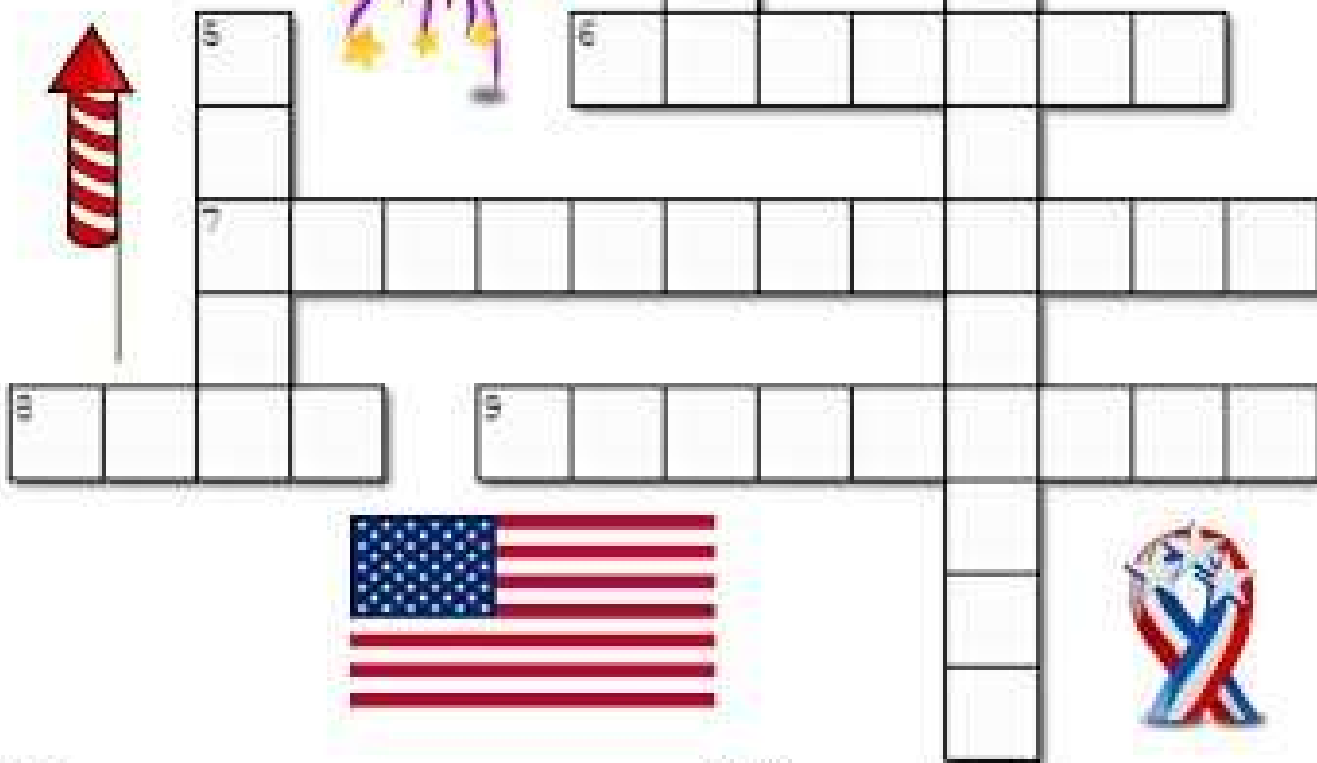
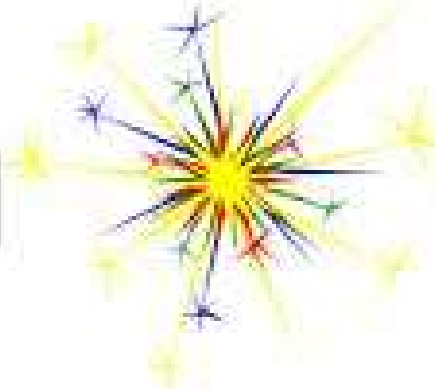

There have been a lot of complaints about yards lately. There is an ordinance to make sure grass and weeds are kept to less than 10 inches. If not, the city will send you a letter to cut it within 5 days or the city will cut it and charge you.

Ordinance 6-12.0408 (11) Hazardous or Unsanitary Premises

States: Those premises on which are accumulations of weeds, vegetation, JUNK, dead organic matter, debris, garbage, offal, rat harborages, stagnant water, combustible materials and similar materials or conditions which constitute fire, health or safety hazards.

This means you need to keep your yards AND alleys picked up and not accumulate JUNK! The garbage men do NOT pick up appliances and tires, so PLEASE take care of these yourself. All other large items can be called into city hall by Monday to be picked up on Tuesday during trash day.
