



What law was enforced in 1894 regarding tramps?

ANSWER TO LAST MONTH'S TRIVIA:



The appointment of Hugo Hoffbauer in 1894 to the post office of Buffalo is satisfactory to almost every citizen of Buffalo. He came to Scott county Iowa November 4, 1852, and has lived in Walcott and Buffalo ever since, except the

time he served his country. Hugo Hoffbauer enlisted August 17, 1862, in the 14th Iowa Infantry as first lieutenant until November

7th, 1864, when he was discharged at Davenport with the regiment. On November 17th 1864, he was recommissioned to take command of the Residuary battallion of the 14th Iowa Infantry. He was honorably discharged on

the first day of September, 1865, at Springfield, III, with the rank of major. He participated in all the battles in which the regiment was engaged during his term of service, to-wit: Fort De Russey, Pleasant Hill, Tupelo, Pilot Knob and other minor engagements. He receives no pension and

his appointment to the post office of Buffalo is a deserving one, as he is well qualified to fill the office. He will no doubt manage the affairs of the office to the satisfaction of the government of the United States and the patrons of the office. As he is making preparations for taking charge of the office, he had better begin practicing writing P.M. after his signature.

The first official proclamation of Thanksgiving as a national day was issued by Abraham Lincoln in 1863, partly in honor of Northern successes in the war that year. Lincoln designated the last Thursday in November "as a day of Thanksgiving and

Praise."



That year, Thanksgiving fell on the day after a crucial Union victory at the battle of Chattanooga. The previous year in late November, armies were on the march during the Fredericksburg and Vicksburg campaigns. Around Thanksgiving 1864, some Union forces

were on the cusp of the bloody battle of Franklin, while others were marching to the sea with William T. Sherman. Due to their harsh surroundings, many Civil War men in the field enjoyed only the most spartan of celebrations. In Kewanee, Illinois, teenage sisters Tirzah and Sarah Vaill received a letter from their older brother, an Illinois infantryman, after Thanksgiving 1861 that described his holiday meal, "hard bread" and salt pork. He added that "during the day I thought of you at home having your nice dinners" and "wishing maybe that you might present a plate to some of us soldiers filled with your own goodies."

In 1864, the Union League Club of New York City pleaded for donations of "cooked poultry and other proper meats" as well as "mince pies, sausages, and fruits" for men in the field. The call brought in some \$57,000 in cash donations, as well as nearly 225,000 pounds of poultry and large quantities of cakes, gingerbread, pickles, apples, vegetables, and cheese. One appreciative soldier saw the deeper meaning, writing that "it isn't the turkey, but the idea that we care for." Levsen Organ Company Few people know the amazing gem we have hidden away here in Buffalo. Rod Levsen started his organ building business in the basement on High Street in Davenport. However, his mother was Eldon Mosier's tutor, so Rod had spent time in Buffalo, and found that the people in Buffalo to be exceptionally nice. It was this that drew Rod to choose Buffalo as the home of his future business.

Rod is a history buff, loves music, studied the piano, but always loved the sound of the pipe organ. During his high school years, he worked at the 1st Presbyterian Church, where he would often "play with" the

organ. He also worked at Kaiser Piano Co, did work for Wicks Organ, and in the late 70s, decided

to go into his own organ business. HISTORY OF LEVSEN ORGAN COMPANY Rodney Levsen, Founder



Levsen Organ Company started as a proprietorship with one employee, Rodney Levsen. Levsen's expertise in piano tuning and electronic organ repair evolved to concert piano tuning and servicing pipe organs and finally in 1954, Levsen Organ Company, a nationwide full-service pipe organ builder came into existence. Levsen Organ Company incorporated in 1980, purchased land and in 1981, moved to a new building located at 221 Maple Street in Buffalo, Iowa. Throughout the 1980's and 90's, the company operated with the main building and a small warehouse just to the south; but in 2003, business increased so measurably that the operations was expanded with a new warehouse just to the north of the main plant. Bringing the total of 10,208 Sq ft of storage and Manufacturing space.

Today, Rodney Levsen, President, and his staff of 9 employees with 3 generations, including his wife Colleen, his son Rod Jr., and grandson Chris, to provide maintenance and tuning services for 220+ organs throughout the Midwest. They take extreme pride in building new organs from scratch as well as selectively rebuilding existing organs, normally with all new windchests and consoles built and fabricated in their own plant. Their operation is mainly woodworking; and they have a well-equipped wood shop. The new warehouse holds an ample stock of basswood, oak, walnut and veneers for the building of organs. Levsen

Organ Company has Sales Representatives strategically located across the United States to assist with projects located in their respective territories; and their Production Schedule usually reflects a 12-month backlog. Levsen has a deep interest in preserving organs that have musical and historical value and has restored many of those organs. Rodney Levsen is a member of the Organ Historical Society (OHS) and a charter member and officer of his local chapter, Eastern Iowa Organ Historical Society. He has been a sustaining member of the American Guild of Organist (AGO) since

Guild of Organist (AGO) since 1965, a member of the American Institute of Organ Builders (AIO)

and an active member of the International Society of Organ Builders (ISO) since its beginning in 1957. As an active member of the ISO, he and his wife have toured hundreds of organs while attending ISO Congresses in Germany, England, France, the Baltic States, Denmark, Norway, Sweden, Belgium and Spain, Switzerland and Canada. Levsen created the burning mandrel, a tool that revolutionized chest-building procedures that is now being used domestically as well as in many foreign countries. Levsen Organ Company also developed software used in organ design and building that has taken scaling and pipe designing to new levels of accuracy and quality unheard of in the past. Levsen Organ Company is inclined to build in the American Classical tonal design, a design that yields an eclectic instrument that is flexible as a worship organ should be. Levsen Organ Company believes in building affordable organs with the finest quality materials and state-of-the-art technology. They build both high quality slider pallet mechanical action and electric action

instruments.



Parks meeting will be November 18th at 6:00 pm. Please remember to wear your mask.

City Hall will be closed on November 26th and 27th for Thanksgiving.

With snow arriving soon, please follow these guidelines:

1. On even-numbered calendar days (example: December 4th), snow plowing will be done on the even-numbered addressed sides of the street. (example is 402 3rd St.) Hereby designated evennumbered sides of the streets are the north sides and the west sides of all streets.

Same goes for the odd-numbered calendar days. Hereby designated odd-numbered sides of the streets are the south sides and the east sides of all streets.

2. These rules are in effect when a snowfall of two (2) or more inches occurs.

3. All vehicles must be moved from the side of the street that is being plowed and not be returned to that side until the snow is plowed to the curb.

4. Any vehicles not being moved may be towed by the city at the owner's expense.
