Buffalo History 101

Erastus H. Bassett, taught a few months school in Buffalo in the winter of 1836-'37, being the first in the place. Mr. Bassett was

engaged in the mercantile business, but trade not being brisk gave him leisure to teach the few present the common branches of an English education. In 1865 a frame school-house, two stories high, was erected at a cost of \$7,000. This was the old Kof P hall that was torn down, corner of Jefferson and 3rd.

You are not guaranteed a personalized dog tag or tee shirt if registering after October 28th. Awards will be given to the top three male and female finishers in all the age groups.

5K Run & Family Run/Walk Races start at 9 AM

These races will be run together, beginning and ending at The American Legion. Maximum of 90 minutes will These races will be run together, beginning and ending be allowed for race due to follow on events.

Kids Run & Battle Buddy Run Races start at 10:30 AM

at The American Legion.

5K Run: Starting at American Legion Post 711, this is an easy, relatively flat course that heads south on old Highway 61 to the turn around point, which is also the water point, manned by Boy Scout Troop 26 and Cub Scout Pack 26 & 28, then back to the Legion.

20, tier hand of the Legion.

Family Run/Walk (1 '2' mile): Starling at the time as the 5K, at American Legion Post 711, the course takes you through the south end of town, out old Highway 61 to just before Oak Lane, then back to the Legion. Friendly pets are considered family and are allowed at owners discretion and risk, and must be leashed at all times.

Battle Buddy Run (½ mile): A two person run where one person must be carried at all times. Alternating who is

Battle Buttley Kurl (25 mile). A low person from where one person must be carried at all unless. Attending with one carried is allowed, but no advancement is allowed during transition. The race starts in front of the Legion, goes north to Highway 61, goes west to the turnaround near Moore Street and then return to the Legion.

Kids Run: A short ½ mile route for children under the age of 12. Course will be the same as the Battle Buddy Run.

Awards: All entries received by October 28, 2022 will be guaranteed a dog tag and tee shirt for all events. Awards will also be given to the top three male and female finishers in the following age groups for the 5K Run: 15 and under, 16 to 22, 23 to 27, 28 to 33, 34 to 37, 38 to 42, 43 to 49, 50 to 59, 60 to 69 and 70 and above.

Packet Pick-up and Registration: Registration will be accepted through the day of the race. Packets can be picked up at American Legion Post 711 in Blue Grass on November 10th & 11th from 4 to 7 PM and the day of the race. Fees: Fees are assessed per individual, except for the family run. Late registration is after October 28th and a \$5 fee will be added to all entries that are not postmarked by that date.



MOTHER'S COOKBOOK



ZUCCHINI CASSEROLE

3 C. unpeeled zucchini 1 1/2 C. water

1 1/2 tsp. salt 1 med. onion

1 green pepper 2 Tbl. oil

1 lb. ground beef (lean)

2 C. toasted bread crumbs

1 C. American cheese shredded

1 can tomato soup

3/4 C. water

pepper to taste

Directions: Cut up zucchini, add to salted water and boil.

Drain well. Saute cut up onion and green pepper in oil until onion is clear in color. Brown and drain ground beef.

Mix all in 2 quart casserole. Bake at 350 degrees for 1 hour.

As caterpillars, Monarchs feed on the leaves of milkweed. Milkweed produces glycoside

toxins to deter animals from eating them. As they feed, monarch caterpillars store up the toxins in their body, making them taste bad. This will in turn deter their predators from eating them. The toxins remain in their system even after metamorphosis, protecting them as adult butterflies as well. As adults, monarchs feed on nectar from a wide range of blooming native plants, including milkweed.
