The first public ferry across the Mississippi, between Burlington and Dubuque,

was established by Captain Clark in 1833, or as soon as emigrants began to cross the river, at Buffalo, and Clark's ferry was the only regular place of crossing in all this region of country. In 1835 he commenced the erection of a public house, a large frame two-story building, which at that time was considered a great enterprise. The house was completed in 1836. He brought the lumber from Cincinnati at a cost of \$60.00 per 1,000 feet..

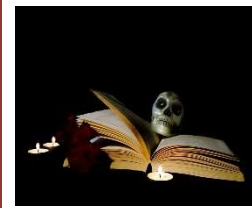

Registration is open through the morning of the race. There is a late registration fee of \$5 added to anyone registering after October 28, 2022. If registering before October 28th, each participant will receive in their packet a personalized dog tag and tee shirt as well as coupons and other things given to us by our sponsors. You are not guaranteed a personalized dog tag or tee shirt if registering after October 28th. Awards will be given to the top three male and female finishers in all the age groups.

The start times and all other information on the race will be posted to the Post 711 website (www.al711iowa.com) as they are finalized. There will be a link to online registration on the website as well. If there are any questions or you want to volunteer to help out, just leave a message at (563) 381-4380 or send an email to: ialegion.post711@gmail.com.

This is our eighth year and we are trying to make this one the best yet. It might be a little chilly out but it is a great organization and a fun time. We use the proceeds from this race, as well as other activities, to fund a lot of different programs in support of our community and our fellow Veterans, such as: American Legion Boys & Girls State, Merit Awards, Boy & Cub Scouts, Hospital supplies, Military Funeral Honors, and more.

5K Run & Family Run/Walk
Races start at 9 AM

These races will be run together, beginning and ending at The American Legion. Maximum of 90 minutes will be allowed for race due to follow on events.

Kids Run & Battle Buddy Run
Races start at 10:30 AM

These races will be run together, beginning and ending at The American Legion.

5K Run: Starting at American Legion Post 711, this is an easy, relatively flat course that heads south on old Highway 61 to the turn around point, which is also the water point, manned by Boy Scout Troop 26 and Cub Scout Pack 26 & 28, then back to the Legion.

Family Run/Walk (1 1/2 mile): Starting at the time as the 5K, at American Legion Post 711, the course takes you through the south end of town, out old Highway 61 to just before Oak Lane, then back to the Legion. Friendly pets are considered family and are allowed at owners discretion and risk, and must be leashed at all times.

Battle Buddy Run (1/4 mile): A two person run where one person must be carried at all times. Alternating who is carried is allowed, but no advancement is allowed during transition. The race starts in front of the Legion, goes north to Highway 61, goes west to the turnaround near Moore Street and then return to the Legion.

Kids Run: A short 1/2 mile route for children under the age of 12. Course will be the same as the Battle Buddy Run.

Awards: All entries received by October 28, 2022 will be guaranteed a dog tag and tee shirt for all events. Awards will also be given to the top three male and female finishers in the following age groups for the 5K Run: 15 and under, 16 to 22, 23 to 27, 28 to 33, 34 to 37, 38 to 42, 43 to 49, 50 to 59, 60 to 69 and 70 and above.

Packet Pick-up and Registration: Registration will be accepted through the day of the race. Packets can be picked up at American Legion Post 711 in Blue Grass on November 10th & 11th from 4 to 7 PM and the day of the race.

Fees: Fees are assessed per individual, except for the family run. Late registration is after October 28th and a \$5 fee will be added to all entries that are not postmarked by that date.

Registration: \$25 for adults, \$20 under the age of 15.

Everyday Heroes (Police, Firefighters, EMS & Teachers): \$20

Veterans, Legion, Auxiliary, S.A.L.: \$15

Family Run: Registration is \$25 for the first two participants, \$15 for each additional participant.

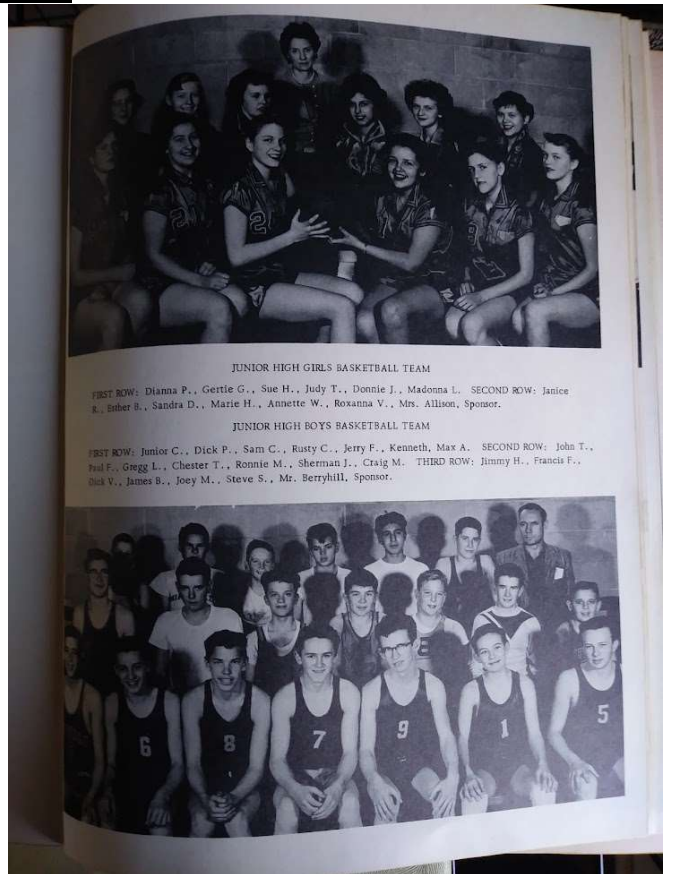

MOTHER'S COOKBOOK



Halloween Spider Treats

- 6 cups Cocoa Krispies cereal
- 4 Tablespoons butter
- 1 (10- or 12-ounce) bag of marshmallows

- 32 thin pretzels
- 32 edible candy eyeballs
- brown gel food coloring (optional, for dark brown spider treats)

Directions:

In a large pot, melt butter over medium heat. Add marshmallows and stir until melted. Stir in a few drops of brown food coloring if a dark brown spider color is desired.

Coat your hands in non-sticking cooking spray or butter. Scoop out about ¼ cup of the mixture at a time and roll / press in your hands to form a ball. Set them on a wax- or parchment-lined surface.

Press 2 candy eyes into the front of each spider.

For each spider, break the 2 large arched parts off of 2 pretzels to create the legs. Use a toothpick or skewer to make holes in the balls and gently press the pretzel pieces into them. If necessary, squeeze gently to secure the pretzels in place.

Many of the vintage recipes are from an old Buffalo women's' cookbook, dated June 1921, which was passed to me from my late grandmother, Virginia Carson. See Jan/Feb 2013 edition for more info) Others were submitted several years ago for a Church cook book.

This page is great sometimes, especially if your dog got loose and someone finds it or if people have things they are looking for or to sell, etc. But if you have something that goes on that the police should know about, CALL THEM!

Something goes missing from your property, CALL THEM! Please stop posting it all over Facebook the next day or even days later. They need to know as soon as possible so they can look into it at that time. Some people think that they shouldn't call the police about little things. That is not true! Recently there have been issues with kids. If the police knew about it at the time, they could have stopped them, got them home and even talked to their parents. You can never go wrong by calling the police.

You may burn in the City of Buffalo, but please remember the ordinance:

16. "Yard wastes": shall mean leaves, tree or bush trimmings. There shall be no burning of grass and grass clippings is prohibited. (Ord. 391, 2004) There is no burning of trash, tires, plastic, etc. Only tree and bush trimmings and leaves.

Also remember your neighbors. Some have medical issues. Try burning on a day or time when people do not have their windows open.

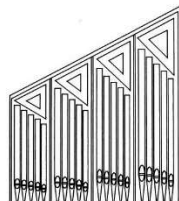

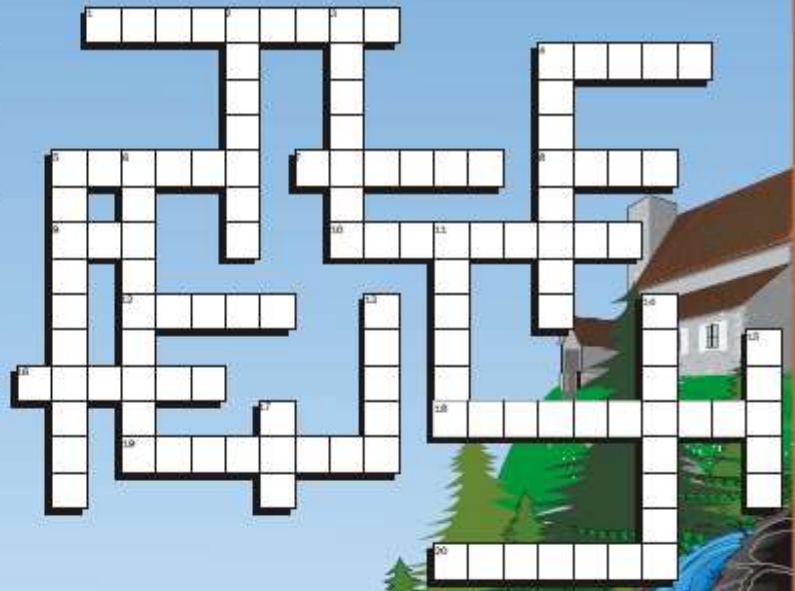
