Deanna Lee "Danny" (Kauffman) Jarvie, age 81, of Buffalo, formerly of Adin, CA, passed away on February 8, 2023 at Genesis Medical Center, East Rusholme. Funeral services will be held on Friday, February 17. 2023 at 10:00 am, at St. Alphonsus Catholic Church, 2618 Boies Avenue, Davenport. Visitation will be held prior to the service from 8:00 am to 9:30 am at the Halligan-McCabe-DeVries Funeral Home, downtown Davenport, Burial will be in Rose Hill Cemetery Buffalo, A luncheon and time of fellowship will be held at the Buffalo Community Center immediately following the committal service. Memorials may be made to the Buffalo Historical Society, or charity of your choice. Danny was born on June 5, 1941 in Davenport, the third daughter of Everette and Eleanor Kauffman of Buffalo. She attended the Buffalo schools until her senior year, and graduated from Bettendorf High School in 1959. 

and captain of a steamboat in the Mississippi. He obtained a large tract of land in Buffalo. Ellen eventually inherited this farm, of which sat a magnificent "cabin". She married Edward Cook in 1866, having George Cram Cook in 1873. While the whole family had love for literature, it was George who launched the Provincetown Players in 1915, creating a revolution in American theater.

A wonderful book has been written by author Jeffery Kennedy, associate professor of interdisciplinary arts and performance at Arizona State University. Mr. Kennedy visited our museum a few years back, as he researched for his book. The book speaks of Buffalo and the "Cook cabin" and its role in literature and playright. From what I have read thus far, I recommend it.

We are looking forward to warmer weather and encouraged by the receipt of seed catalogs coming in the mail! Soon after the grass turns green, the dandelions will pop up! Here are some interesting facts about dandelions:

Every part of the dandelion is useful: root, leaves, flower, It can be used for food, medicine and dye for coloring.

Up until the 1800s people would pull grass out of their lawns to make room for dandelions and other useful "weeds" like chickweed, malva, and chamomile.

Dandelion seeds are often transported away by a gust of wind and they travel like tiny parachutes. Seeds are often carried as many as 5 miles from their origin!

Animals such as birds, insects and butterflies consume nectar or seed of dandelion. 🥾 🥾 Dandelion flowers do not need to be pollinated to form seed.

Dandelion can be used in the production of wine and root beer. Root of dandelion can be used as a substitute for coffee. 🥊 😡

Dandelinn is used in folk medicine to treat infections and liver disorders. Tea made of dandelion act as diuretic.

If you mow dandelions, they'll grow shorter stalks to spite you.

Dandelions are, quite possibly, the most successful plants that exist, masters of survival worldwide. 🦺

Top with Cool Whip and drizzle with Hershey's Syrup.


Refrigerate several hours.

## **BUFFALO TRIVIA QUESTION OF THE MONTH:**

What was Andrew Campbell known for?

#### **ANSWER TO LAST MONTH'S QUESTION:**

Leroy Dodge emigrated to Iowa in 1836, from the State of New York. He was for many years, a pilot on the Mississippi, and then commnder of steamboats. Having secured some 400 acres of land along the river and bluff above Buffalo, he built a pleasant cottage on the banks of the river and turned his attention to agriculture,

principally to stock-raising, a business in which he was quite successful. In 1852 he represented Scott County in
