Buffalo History 101

The old Knights of Pythias Hall was built in 1850 and used as a school until 1900, when the Buffalo school was completed. The hall then was moved to a new site. From 1919 to 1931, Chris Zogg, the Postmaster, sold

patent medicines there , and the building was used \cdot as an early movie theater.




