families and organizations from as far away as Muscatine, Silvis and beyond. Let's just say this is not your grandma's bingo parlor any more. The Community Center has operated as an extension of the City of Buffalo since it was built in 1985, however the Center is financially self-sufficient with all monetary profits continually reinvested in onsite improvements.

As a functional non-profit the Center is also able to offer extremely reasonable, community oriented rental fees. All Buffalo residents receive a \$50 discount on rentals and many local organizations from throughout the area regularly use the facility for fundraising events because the rates are so competitive. Not to mention the professionally staffed, fully stocked cash bar add-on for \$75 is an unbeatable bonus. Still to come - long awaited bathroom and kitchen renovations are now next on the list of improvements to make the Community Center even more appealing for local celebrations and festivities.

the Buffalo Days Team and Buffalo Elementary PTA.






BUFFALO TRIVIA QUESTION OF THE MONTH:

The Knights of Pythias Hall was originally built on the site of the old Buffalo High School in 1850 and used as a school until 1900, when the Buffalo school was completed. The hall then was moved to a new site (SE corner of Jefferson and 3rd). Chris Zogg, the Postmaster, sold patent medicines there, and the building was used an an early movie theater.

- Proof of Social Security Numbers for all household members (documentation required)

- Most recent electric bill

WAGE EARNERS:
