

Daily specials, rotating soup options and occasional menu changes bring extra variety to Janie's food offerings but she has also remained faithful to some favorite specialty dishes, including a Welcome to Buffalo chicken sandwich (the spicy kind) and a delicious take on a fried German bologna sandwich (complete with Boetje's mustard and an egg on top if you're up for it!). Of course, breakfast is always an option - "The Works" (potatoes, choice of meat, onions, peppers, mushrooms, cheese, gravy, eggs and toast) is a solid standby, and the very memorable raspberry stuffed French toast has made Janie many loyal brunch customers. Recent new additions include Jitter Juice in a rainbow of flavor combinations and specialty flavored cold brew coffee. At customers' requests Janie has also started using bottled water for her beverages and cooking requirements while the city water supply remains unusually high in iron.



Janie loves having a bright family atmosphere at the Café and even offers a treasure box for kiddos to choose from for a special complimentary treat at the end of their meal.

Sunday mornings are especially entertaining at the Café with professional magician T.J. regularly appearing to amaze customers and leave them in disbelief at his table-side shenanigans. The Café's Facebook page is updated daily with lunch specials (complete with tantalizing photos) and special events. Call in a to-go order, check out a magical Sunday brunch, grab an afternoon cold brew (coffee, of course), or just stop in to say hi. Chances are you'll find Janie smiling her infectious and tenacious smile, serving up tasty comfort food, chatting to the customers, and all around living the dream!.

### **MOTHER'S COOKBOOK** SWEET ROLL DOUGH

Baking sheet or pan preheat oven to 15-20 Minutes 425 2 cakes quick yeast 3 tps. Salt 6 C. Flour sifted 1/4 C. sugar 1/4 C. warm water 2 eggs 1/4 C. shortening 2C. warm milk



Soften yeast with sugar in 1/4 cup lukewarm water. Beat eggs, add milk, add yeast-sugar mixture, salt, half the flour. Mix thoroughly. Add melted shortening and beat

well. Add balance of flour or enough to make soft dough. Turn out on floured board. Knead until smooth and elastic without sticking to board. Place in a well greased bowl. Grease top of dough. Cover. Let rise until double in bulk. Knead down. then let rise 45 minutes.

Use for rolls. Bake on any type baking sheet, or us muffin pans and make cloverleaf rolls. Makes about 3 dozen

City Hall will be closed on February 19, 2024 for President's Day.

#### LIHEAP Customers:

There always seems to be some confusion on what you need to pay. LIHEAP is just a protection of not getting your electric turned off for non-payment. On April 1, 2024 ALL of your electric bill will need to be paid in full or the city will disconnect for nonpayment. As for your water, you are responsible for ALL of the other items on your bill (water, sewer, storm, recycling, tax, penalties). If this is not paid in a timely matter, you will get a door hanger and if after that it is still not paid, you will be disconnected. City Hall has had some conversations with some residents that think they can pay \$50 or \$100 every couple of months and that will be ok. That is not ok! You still need to keep up on the rest of your bill. Once your utility is disconnected, you will be required to pay your bill in full (minus the electric) and a \$70 fee for disconnect/connect in cash or charge, no checks.

#### To all other customers:

Paying your bill on a timely matter is the same for you. You will be disconnected if you get a door hanger and do not pay, or don't even contact City Hall. There has been some incidents where City Hall has taken the brunt of some angry residents. They are only doing their job and following the ordinances. If you have a problem or concern about these ordinances, please contact your council members. We will not tolerate any personal attacks on our city employees.

If you have a problem paying your bill on time or would like it to be taken out automatically, we have that option. Please go to our website, buffaloiowa.org and click on the updated billing process. You will make an account where you can pay when you want or automatically and use e-check (with no fees) or credit card (with fee). If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to ask.

As for the progress of the well, they are still working on it. We are hoping it will be tested soon and when we get back those results, we will post on our website and Facebook.
